Again this week, here are a few reflections:

- People have asked about my wife; apparently, I didn't do a very good job of sharing information about her.
- What draws us to a church in the beginning may not be the reasons we stay during the hard times.
- Varying intensity of grief over Corben's (and Mara's) upcoming departure from Zion.
- Several individuals commented that parts of the building are now larger than currently needed and wondered about new ways to utilize the space.
- Affirmation for increased transparency in decision-making processes, such as the recent sprinkler system repair.

<u>MCC in need of material resources</u>: MCC is resuming shipments of material resources to Ukraine. Five containers of emergency supplies are being shipped to Ukraine in the next few months with more planned for later in the year. With this increase in demand for supplies for Ukraine and other countries around the world, MCC's inventory of material resources is getting low. *We need comforters and relief, hygiene, school, dignity, infant care and sewing kits, as well as soap and towels.* Your donations will provide relief and a tangible sign of hope to people in Ukraine and other difficult situations around the world. Spiritual Leadership Minutes May 7, 2022

Present: Corben Weaver Boshart, Dan Miller, Lonnie Short, Sue Short, Suz Wirick, Mike Zimmerman. Absent Greg Nofziger

Opening: We met on Sunday May 7, 2022 after Sunday school so Dan could be present. Corben used Romans 8:26-38 referring to God's providence. Asking is it the broader church or our moving forward and reminding us that our plan was predestined before we even knew. He ended with a quote saying "all will be well, all will be well, and all manner of things will be well."

Old Business: * MCUSA Special Delegate Session: Corben Weaver Boshart, attending but not as a delegate; Sue Short, Ilse Goertz and Mike Zimmerman are the four attending the conference leaving May 27, 2022. We reviewed the "listening session" with the congregation, it noted widespread affirmation that we change our guidelines to suit our practices. Mike is going to prepare a summary of the counsel received from the meeting for the congregation. * Update on Housing for Dan: At this point Dan feels comfortable with the Zimmerman apartment but would like to visit the other apartment before making a final decision.* Update on Corben's exit plans: Corben's primary concern is he wants everything done well for Zion and he wants what feels good for both Sue and Dan. He asked the elders what they feel needs to be done before he leaves. Following a time of discussion, it was determined that June 26, 2022 will be the "Farewell Sunday" for Corben and Mara. On Sunday May 15th he will bring more detailed information to Zion's congregants. He also talked about his desire to find opportunities to reflect on good things he sees at Zion since his beginning, such as the Lombard process and where Zion is today. He wondered aloud about how Zion would describe the kind of community they have become and what the phrase, "all people are invited"; from our vision statement means to them. Corben asked for ways he can be most useful at Zion until his exit. It was suggested he summarize the information for the delegates for the Zion's record and give us a conference report upon his return from convention.

New Business: * Sue's Ordination: June 5th, 2022. We look forward to celebrating this milestone with Sue! *** Donut's with Dan:** after some planning we decided that Dan will determine what questions he would like to ask when meeting with groups of up to eight people, which can include children, teenagers and adults of all ages. He feels this will be very helpful for him to put faces with names. ***Senior Sunday:** May 15, 2022 *** Baptismal Service:** May 22, 2022, the participants chose to have it at the Weldy/Yoder pond weather permitting. ***Other:** The elders were to suggest possible candidates for the position of elder to fill the open position left by Chris Liechty's passing. Many names were suggested and will be passed on to Gifts Discernment Team.

Pastoral Concerns: We reviewed various care concerns in the congregation.
