Pastoral Care Update

As Corben completed his time on June 26, and Dan shifts to full-time on July 1, we (Sue and Dan) wish to state that pastoral care remains a priority for the two of us.

- 1. We commit to walking with folks during crisis moments. You can contact either one of us directly, whether or not we are currently in the office. We will listen and pray with you over the phone, as that is desired. The pastors will work with you to determine who is best situated to respond beyond the initial contact. Even if Dan is in Goshen at the time, he is only two hours away if he needs to be physically present. Contact information for the pastors is listed weekly at the top of Zion's newsletter.
- 2. People have ownership of their own story. If you become aware of a challenging situation someone else is facing, you can encourage that person to talk with a pastor. You can also offer to share information with a pastor if the person is open to that.
- 3. Elders understand their role in the congregation includes pastoral care. Contact information for elders can be found at the top of the Zion weekly newsletter.
- 4. We commit to being in touch with congregational caregivers so the congregation can offer care in practical and helpful

There can be hiccups when roles change, so we ask that you inform us when we falter, and for your patience as we work together. We know people's preferences differ about how and when they wish to receive care from pastors. We depend strongly on your direct communication with us.

We want to give special appreciation to the Elders for the two months we (Sue and Dan) have had working together and getting to know one another. It feels like it gave us a head start for this time.

Spiritual Leadership Team (SLT) Minutes June 2022

Present: Corben Weaver Boshart, Dan Miller, Greg Nofziger, Lonnie Short, Sue Short, Suz Wirick and Mike Zimmerman via zoom. Guest participant: Micah Frankenfield.

Opening: We met for a light meal, as it was our last SLT meeting with Corben. Greg gave a testimonial called "Life is a Curve Ball," reflecting back to his days of playing baseball and experiencing a curve ball which caused him to strike out.

Old Business: Micah Frankenfield came to review Agreement #8 – Structures and Leadership. Their team wanted the SLT's opinion on how this document has been working for the SLT after being in effect for nine months. The Structures and Leadership team are looking to give better definition between Spiritual Leadership Team and Church Council. He asked what church programs or initiatives we feel weakened or strengthened over the last 12 months. In summary, the SLT sees that leadership at Zion has changed, and has noticed people are recognizing opportunities and moving forward on their own initiative. We also finalized plans for Corben and Mara's last Sunday, on June 26th.

New Business - Timeline for Forming Search Committee. We addressed what SLT needs to do prior to selecting a search committee. Dan designed a plan on how to set up the committee for a successful pastoral search. It includes congregational participation through the fall. He recognizes that Zion has done significant work on structure and conflict, and a vision statement is in place, which is very helpful in presenting who Zion is to a new candidate. He had a diagram highlighting five areas congregations address during significant leadership changes: 1. Heritage: grief, celebration, retell narrative and vision, and establish a Handbook; 2. Mission/Vision: what still resonates, guidelines for emerging initiatives; 3. Connections: MCUSA, Ohio Conference; 4. Leadership: watch for people to tap, and 5. Future: Covid, remind people of stance going forward. Dan explained that candidates are more eager to accept a pastoral position if they see the congregation continuing to move forward, and experimenting with new things and ideas. From his past experiences, Dan finds it to be more beneficial if the Spiritual Leadership Team fills out the Congregational Information Form that is needed to begin the search, rather than the search committee. This method is different from past processes used at Zion, but the SLT is more familiar with the information needed. It is helpful for the candidate to know the definition of the pastoral team. Once that is defined and passed on to the search committee, the committee is better equipped to move forward in the process. It was decided that on Sunday morning June 19th Lonnie would make a preliminary announcement stating the elders are in the process of preparing for a formal search committee. We will be forthcoming on our progress, hoping to have a team in place and ready to begin their work by the first of next year, paving the way for a House of Peace.

Congregational concerns: were light.
