For worship this Sunday

Since it's a holiday this seems like a great opportunity to try something new. The worship planners are inviting those present this Sunday to participate in two experiments.

First, we invite everyone to sit in the chairs in the front of the sanctuary or in the wings. We wonder what it would be like to sit where we can see each other. It might be tricky as we figure out how to observe physical distancing. If it feels too close, we encourage people to spread out so they feel comfortable.

Second, after the sermon there will be an invitation to come for anointing with oil. Dan will be preaching from Rev 7:9-17 which speaks of no more hunger, thirst, or scorching heat. Instead, "the lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd" who will guide them to springs of the water of life. Is there some way you need Jesus, the lamb at the center of the throne, to be your shepherd? If so, we invite you to come for anointing at any one of the stations as a response to the sermon.



Upcoming Worship

July Worship: In July, we'll center ourselves in a variety of scripture texts, either from the lectionary, or as a 'pastor's choice.' On Sunday, July 10th, come enjoy the music of Herm Weaver and Vince Buckwalter during worship, and in concert in the sanctuary during the second hour. The lifelong friends and singer-songwriters reunite after meeting in 1977 at Hesston College (Kan.) The duo performs original vocals, mixed in with acoustic guitar and piano. <u>August Worship</u>: During August, we'll return to our Front Porch to hear faith stories from one another, and reflect on ways in which God has been present during times of change and transition. You are invited to dress casually for worship, bring your coffee, and embrace these last few weeks of summer.

Pastoral Care Update

As Corben completed his time on June 26, and Dan shifts to full-time on July 1, we (Sue and Dan) wish to state that pastoral care remains a priority for the two of us.

- 1. We commit to walking with folks during crisis moments. You can contact either one of us directly, whether or not we are currently in the office. We will listen and pray with you over the phone, as that is desired. The pastors will work with you to determine who is best situated to respond beyond the initial contact. Even if Dan is in Goshen at the time, he is only two hours away if he needs to be physically present. Contact information for the pastors is listed weekly at the top of Zion's newsletter.
- 2. People have ownership of their own story. If you become aware of a challenging situation someone else is facing, you can encourage that person to talk with a pastor. You can also offer to share information with a pastor if the person is open to that.
- 3. Elders understand their role in the congregation includes pastoral care. Contact information for elders can be found at the top of the Zion weekly newsletter.
- 4. We commit to being in touch with congregational caregivers so the congregation can offer care in practical and helpful ways.

There can be hiccups when roles change, so we ask that you inform us when we falter, and for your patience as we work together. We know people's preferences differ about how and when they wish to receive care from pastors. We depend strongly on your direct communication with us.

We want to give special appreciation to the Elders for the two months we (Sue and Dan) have had working together and getting to know one another. It feels like it gave us a head start for this time.
