Upcoming Worship

Dwelling in the Word Fall Worship Series: This summer, we were invited to join other congregations around Ohio Conference in reading through the entire New Testament together using the same Bible reading schedule. **Starting September 18th**, we'll be using scripture texts from this Bible reading schedule each week as a way to deepen our thinking about what we've been reading. We'll reflect together on questions such as "What are we being invited toward in this text?"

If you've already been reading along, keep it up! If you haven't started yet, we encourage you to jump in at today's date on the schedule. (There are extra paper copies of the entire Bible reading schedule on the table across from the mailboxes. Or, contact the office and we can email one to you.) If you fall behind, pop back in when you can and restart with the reading for today's date. Whether you complete the entire New Testament, or just read straight through a book or two, the important thing is to just keep going and to experience larger sections of scripture in their context together.

"With my whole heart, I seek you; do not let me stray from your commandments. I treasure your word in my heart, so that I may not sin against you." (Psalm 119:10-11, NRSV)

<u>September 25th: Bridge Sunday #2</u> the Elders will share parts of the Congregational Information Form as a step of transparency about what will be sent to potential candidates. It is also a way of giving us all a picture of who Zion is now. Second, we will see if we can find a bridge between Zion's heritage and the future. Joe has done extensive research for the past 25 years on the congregation in Montbeliard, France, the home congregation for many Amish Mennonite immigrants to Fulton County. He will speak about factors that may have led to immigration, and some of the religious and cultural traditions that were brought along to our area.
