New Announcements

<u>UPDATE</u> on settling immigrants in our area: Many have been asking for a status update. Thank you for staying in touch and for your continued support! In September when we worshiped with Central Mennonite Church, we made an announcement with an appeal for housing leads. The next day, a team from Central contacted Lori with interest in meeting together to see if it made sense to collaborate, as they had begun exploring sponsoring refugees. In addition, the group from Central has housing leads! Long story short, we have been meeting together and exploring working together. The past couple weeks the pace of our progress has sped up remarkably!

We are excited to be collaborating with Central with refugee resettlement. We originally were looking at asylum seekers. However, we found that Ukrainian refugees, known as "humanitarian parolees," are an easier path to start and "get our feet wet." Both groups of people are in dire need of sponsors to settle in a new community. Please continue to think about opportunities for refugee housing. Also consider ways in which you can help as refugee sponsorship becomes a reality.

Over 30 people from Zion stepped up to offer support in a variety of ways, which is significant and a positive outreach. It's important that we hear your ideas.
