October 10, 2022

Agenda for SLT Retreat – October 15th: Dan had the agenda put together and sent us each a copy. He encouraged us to spend time reflecting on the two preparation questions prior to our gathering.

Discuss Upcoming Bridge Sunday: We met on October 27th to finalize the October 30th Bridge Sunday. Our goal was to present the remaining information to the congregation at that gathering with the exception of the "Interpretation" section of the form, which is still being finished.

Membership Request: Sue reported that she has been contacted by persons interested in transferring their membership to Zion.

Sojourners Sunday School Class: Lonnie reported that his Sunday school class is considering being a part of the "Anabaptist Bible Project." 2025 is the 500th anniversary of the birth of the Anabaptist movement. In honor of this, groups such as Sunday School class or small groups are invited to consider submitting notes for a new study Bible to be released in 2025. Study notes from 500 groups across the broader church will be included. Each group would be given a short text to study. The Sojourners would like to invite John Roth to come to Zion to share information on this project, and also his expertise on Anabaptist history.

Refugee Update: The joint group from Zion and Central also known as the Refugee Support Team (RST) has worked through Welsome.us to find a match for a family. We have made contact with a family and they are working to make their way to the U.S.

See attached photo. Igor works in tech, Karina is a stay-at-home mom, and their son Bogdan is 10 years old. They are Christians. They speak limited English. They fled their home in Luhansk in eastern Ukraine. This area is currently occupied by Russia. They traveled to far western Ukraine and had been living in a temporary shelter in a Baptist church in Chernivtsi. They recently traveled to Romania and applied as refugees with the Romanian government. They will live in a basement apartment at Jen (Sauder) Nichols. They could arrive within the next few weeks!

Sponsored refugees need full assistance until paperwork goes through. This can take one to three months. Once paperwork is processed they are able to apply for work and receive benefits such as SNAP. The goal is for the family to become independent.

We will need folks to help with meals, clothing, transportation to appointments, groceries or trips to grocery stores, and hospitality. Thanks for considering ways that you can help.

Flickering for Fairlawn is a luminary event that will raise funds to assist in the purchase of a new nurse call system for the Care Center and also remember all those that need our help as they age.
