...but never the last word

The sermon on leadership two weeks ago didn't address the importance of women in leadership. I am a strong believer in having a mix of men and women in leadership. I believe a good mix better reflects the fullness of God and increases the breadth of perspective on the team.

Friederike Fabritius, neuroscientist and author of <u>The Brain-Friendly Workplace</u>, believes having women in leadership benefits companies. She also believes in having a variety of cultural perspectives. Rather than aiming at diversity targets though, she says the way to work at diversity is in seeking a balanced mix of the four brain types identified in her book. I wondered if she would say more about her rationale or about how this approach worked in real world situations, but didn't find anything.

Fabritius interviewed Dr John Medina on research showing that having power changes the brain. Women need to be as aware of this dynamic as men. I wondered whether brain changes would be the same for women and men. Apparently power impacts everyone's brain in similar ways. There is an article in the July/August 2017 issue of *The Atlantic* titled "Power Causes Brain Damage," that gives another description of research findings.
