Work done during the last two Bridge Sundays in October and November shaped what went into the Congregational Information Form, and helped to set up the congregation for a successful pastoral search. Copies of the Summaries of the Congregational Information Form are available in the office. In addition, there are now summaries of the last two Bridge Sundays for anyone who would like to see them.

Spiritual Leadership Team (SLT) minutes

March 13, 2023

Suz led the opening, focusing Chapter 3 of *Pursuing God's Will Together: A Discernment Practice for Leadership Groups:* Groups can process with grace as they work on discernment, and this discernment should take place in and through the Trinity. She talked about the idea of practicing discernment in situations in our personal lives as well, so we would be more experienced with it in groups. She thinks it would be helpful to suggest this book to the search team. Suz led in prayer as we moved on to the rest of the meeting.

Reflection from the delegates on Ohio Conference Annual Assembly (ACA): The consultant hired by the Conference seemed to direct conversation in a way that allowed for good dialogue, and processing around the tables was good. Discussed some of the statistics of the various traffic light surveys at ACA, and noted a possible failure of MCUSA to communicate effectively with leadership of Ohio Conference, especially in relation to the 2nd option. Discussed the rescinding of the membership guidelines at the MCUSA special delegate session in Kansas City in May 2022 and the role it played in activating Ohio Conference's review of affiliation.

Next steps for Zion based on ACA outcome: Discussed what other congregations in Ohio may do related to the recent ACA vote. Discussed how to present information from ACA with the congregation. The Zion traffic light survey from February 19 showed strong support for staying with MCUSA. The outcome of the vote at ACA is that the Ohio Conference will continue to be affiliated with MCUSA. Since there seems to be weariness about processing the affiliation issue, and since Zion's feedback indicated support for Ohio Conference remaining in MCUSA, we don't feel a sense of urgency for another congregational meeting at this point.

Discussion done by congregation on Bridge Sundays 3 and 4 (last fall): Copies of these summaries will be available in the office Input from those two Sundays shaped what was written in the Congregational Information Form (CIF). The congregation will be reminded that the completed CIF is also available to be read.

Update from pastoral search team: Suz reported that the committee continues to be hard at work, and that there will be an update for the congregation soon. SLT recommends reminding the congregation that the search team is open to hearing suggestions of potential candidates that they may know.

MCUSA convention in July 3-8; Delegate session July 7-8: In addition to Sue, the SLT will invite one additional delegate.

Review for Dan: Micah, Dan, and Lonnie have been in conversation about processing whether to extend Dan's time beyond one year. Lonnie will send the three questions out to the SLT for discussion at a later time.

Pastoral concerns were discussed.
