## **Collaborative Ministry Team Pastor Update**

Sunday July 9th concluded our voting process for John David Thacker. The Search team is pleased to report that John David was affirmed with a 93% vote of confidence. 133 votes were received in total, 124 were "yes" votes and 9 were "no" votes.

John David has formally accepted Zion's call to serve as a full time equivalent on the Collaborative Ministry Team. A covenant for his first term will be worked on in the coming weeks.

The search team and the SLT are currently working on plans for when John David will officially join Zion's Collaborative Ministry Team, as well as when Dan Miller's term with Zion will wrap up. The transition is likely to begin this fall and be completed before the end of the year. As more details are available they will be shared. Thank You everyone for your participation in the search process.

## <u>The last page</u>...

#### ...but never the last word

I want to return to the comment I made during announcements last week about being glad the vote calling John David Thacker was not unanimous. This might feel contrary to Zion culture and to stories about how Phil Frey worked to build unanimity about congregational decisions. Pastor Frey gave people who lost a chance to come around and support the majority by holding another vote. It is important to consider our attitude when we lose! Many churches have a story about the person who voted against the church addition but was first in line to help break ground.

And at the same time, holding additional votes until everyone comes around can create unintended pressure to pretend we are of one mind. In my experience, if a vote is unanimous someone is usually lying. I mean, I can have two or more opinions just by myself!

Sometimes, listening to those who dissent allows us to be honest about potential difficulties.

For that reason, I am often relieved that a vote is not unanimous. I figure people are being honest.
