"Treasure in Clay Jars: A Series on Grief:" A full human life, even for Christians, includes both love and loss. Opening ourselves to the risk of love also means opening ourselves to the pain of loss. Some of us overestimate how "strong" we are until we are faced with hardship and loss, and we are forced to see our own mortality. Others of us consider ourselves too "fragile," and we are afraid to take risks because we might get hurt. Both are defenses to protect us from grief. Grief is hard and Jesus dwells within us. He is our "treasure" that we hold in the clay jar of our humanity. We don't have to be stronger than we are, or live stuck in fear of moving forward. Drawing on this image from 2 Corinthians 4:5-7, we'll explore the complicated human experience of grief during the month of September.

Spiritual Leadership Team minutes - August 21st

We began with a delicious meal organized by Suz, as a way of celebrating Lonnie's work on the SLT and saying good-bye as his term ends. Each person took a moment to share what s/he appreciated about Lonnie.

Devotional: Greg led us in a discussion from chapter 7 of the book Pursuing God's Will Together, focusing on the practices of truth telling and confession. Greg presented us with some real life scenarios and asked us to think about when we might find ourselves backing away from telling the truth. We considered the ways it is beneficial to be honest with each other so that we can trust the sincerity of group members as we discern God's will together. Sue led us in communion as a closing to the devotional time.

Maintenance of the church website was brought up by Barb. Does it make sense for the group who has been working with the website to become an official part of the church structure? If so, under what part of the current church structure that might fall? It was decided that this is a Council matter, and to ask to be added to their next meeting's agenda.

Gifts Discernment recommends reducing the size of the group to four elders. The Gifts Discernment team has asked a variety of people, but has not received affirmative replies. One course of action would be to go with four this term, but start talking to some people about considering it for the next term. A new elder will definitely be needed next year because Mike's term ends and he cannot repeat. We brainstormed some ideas for addressing the situation. It was also noted that the Church Council has the ability to bring someone into a position midterm, if needed.

Plans are being made for the transition from Dan's time at Zion, to that of John David. John David will be starting on October 1. Installation, officiated by Tony Doehrmann, may be on October 1 or 8, depending on Tony's schedule. We'd like to have a celebration, including a congregational meal, on John David's first Sunday. We'll be saying good-bye to Dan on October 15th during the SS hour. Communion will be on October 1 for World Communion Sunday.

The Pastor-Spouse retreat is Nov 10-12, with a September 1 registration deadline. Sue and Stan plan to attend. It was suggested that John David could be offered the weekend off too, or that he could choose another weekend for a personal retreat, if he wished.

Dan provided the SLT with materials from the Colossian Forum that frame conflict as an opportunity for spiritual growth. This could be a possibility for some short term small groups to work at strengthening what was learned about listening and directly addressing one another.

We discussed next steps for the Processing Ministry Ideas plan. Plans need to be made about a name for this plan, whether there should be an offer of start-up funds, and the best way to present the plan to the congregation. It was decided that this should be reviewed with the Church Council and Mission and Service Committee before sharing it with the congregation

Greg and Barb are willing to serve as Zion's delegates to the Ohio Conference for this year.

Pastoral concerns were discussed.

The next meeting will be Monday, September 11.

<u>Update from Gifts Discernment Ministry Team:</u> We received a total of 79 responses (68 paper, 11 electronic) to the recent proposed slate of candidates to serve on Zion's various Ministry Teams, beginning in the new church year on September 1. The overall affirmation rate was 99%, with all candidates affirmed by 96%, or greater. An updated list of Zion's Ministry Team members will be made available soon. <u>The Builders Sunday School Class</u> will not be meeting the month of September. We encourage you all to join the optional class that will meet in room 310. The Builders Class will meet again beginning in October.

MCC Pipeline to Prison Learning Tour on November 1-3 in Goshen and Elkhart: Join MCC Great Lakes for three days focusing on the complexities of the U.S. criminal justice system as seen in northern Indiana. Participants will learn about the systemic forces at play that have led to mass incarceration and the criminalization of marginalized groups. The group will hear diverse perspectives from community organizations and people experiencing arrest, incarceration and reentry. Upcoming Event: Concerned about the growing number of mass shootings in recent years, and inspired by the MCC curriculum, "Fear Not: Creating a Plan to Respond to Active Violence," several people from area Mennonite congregations began meeting with an interest in planning an event for all ages. As they planned, the group sought guidance from Shalom, local sheriff's departments, NAMI, the ADAMhs Board, MCC peace educators, and Mike Martin of 'Raw Tools' (who blacksmiths weapons used in violent crimes into garden tools). The event, "Disarming Violence: Starting a Conversation about Gun Safety in our Community," will be held on Sunday afternoon, September 24th, from 4:00-6:15pm, outside in the parking lot of Central Mennonite Church. (If inclement weather, in the fellowship hall.) You are invited to come grab your dinner at Benny's Loncheria food truck, enjoy a snack of kettle corn and slushies, participate in children's activities, browse information booths, enter a drawing to win a gun safe, listen to speakers, and watch a blacksmithing demonstration. (Planning Committee: Nancy Roynon Beck, Heather Myers, Brittany Spotts, Allen Rutter, Sue Short, and Joel Shenk. We are grateful recipients of one of this year's Ohio Conference Ministry Grants, which has funded this event.)
