Spiritual Leadership Team minutes

September 11, 2023

Sue opened the meeting with a reflection on Chapter 8 of *Pursuing God's Will Together* by Ruth Haley Barton. This chapter addresses the value of having a covenant within a leadership group. One of the observations made was that when we make covenants with each other, we are also making them with God. At the end, we prayed together the prayer of commitment from that chapter of the book.

Mike had distributed a copy of the schedule for leading the Prayer for the Church and World. Since there are four elders now, the schedule has seven Sundays that are not yet assigned to anyone. One idea for those Sundays would be to ask members of the congregation to lead the prayer. Other possibilities would be to have people on the Worship team take turns, or ask worship leaders to pray on the Sunday they lead. It was decided that Sue would ask the Worship team if they would be willing to help look for people for those seven Sundays.

John David's first day at Zion is October 1. He will be officially installed on October 8, and will preach.

Activities for October 15, Dan's last day at Zion, were mentioned. We'd like to do a short program during the Sunday school hour, but no specific details were discussed at this meeting.

We were updated on John David moving to the community. He has moved into his apartment, has visited some area churches on Sundays, and is getting to know the community and surrounding area.

We discussed several questions regarding John David's start-up. The current memo of understanding describes full-time as 5.5 days/week. It was decided that 48 hours per week might be a better way of expressing the work week expectations. The understanding is there could be weeks where events might make it necessary to work longer than 48 hours, and that the pastor then makes adjustments to keep the balance by working less than 48 hours the next week.

The celebration to commemorate the completion of the Lombard process will be put off until after John David is here. Plans for this could be discussed at an upcoming church council meeting.

The topic of reducing the SLT to four elders instead of five was again brought up. Gift Discernment supports the idea of going to four elders, noting that the constitution calls for one elder for every 100 members. If we do feel five is a better number, it would be good to change the constitution to reflect that. Several people pointed out that the constitution is outdated and not viewed as a helpful reference. Since both Phil Bontrager and Dan are leaving, they will hand off ongoing work to the new SLT chair, GDT chair and pastor. Going forward it might be a good idea for the SLT to work more closely with Gifts Discernment.

In anticipation of our meeting, Dan had shared a document with ideas to continue building capacity to care for one another across differences. If there were to be conversations in the future about sexuality, what would we want the outcomes to be?

- Some suggestions put forth by the group:
- that we could have a conversation where everyone felt comfortable expressing their opinions;
- that if necessary we could agree to disagree;
- that we would be able to have everyone feel like they had been heard;
- that through this discussion, we would grow in ability to share Christ's love with each other and the world.
- What format might we use for processing this topic? Dan suggests we consider the Colossian Way (seeing conflict as an opportunity for spiritual growth) as a way to do this. More information can be found at https://colossianforum.org/

It is a goal to have a spiritual theme for our SLT meetings and work during the year. We can think about this more next month when John David is here. ...but never the last word

Back in late 2020, COVID-19 continued upending life. My nurse friends at Goshen Hospital were overwhelmed with high census counts. The people with whom I worked at the conference office were doing a great job of adapting, which we had to do continually. We held Zoom meetings and sponsored webinars with social service agencies. I communicated in short videos, and recorded sermons that congregations could use.

I came across a song on YouTube that expressed what I didn't even know I wanted to say. It was called "The Blessing UK," sung by 65+ churches across the UK. Using a version of the benediction I use each Sunday, they sang a blessing that was passionate and hopeful – it watered my soul. In addition to the accents, the diversity of those involved caught me immediately – a representation of the world! The video ended with this message, "Our buildings may be closed but the church is very much alive!"

I soon learned that others were inspired to create versions for their countries. I listened to singers from around the world where I had connections, and prayed for those places and people I knew.

In preparing the last several weeks for World Communion Sunday, which we celebrate this Sunday, I came across another version called <u>The World Blessing 2023</u>. It combines portions of 500 videos. Beautiful! I invite you to watch people from across the body of Christ pray The Blessing. Watch as many times as you want! The song still moves me.

When we gather for worship this week, let's gather recognizing Christ-followers from around the world. We are part of an imperfect vessel, and yet we are part of a living organism called by Christ. Borrowing from Zion Mennonite Church's vision statement, we can grow as "a House of Peace where all people are invited to share Christ's love with each other and the world." May it be so.
