Advent Worship 2023 - "A Light Shines in the Darkness" Advent is a time when we hold in tension the darkness of our world with the hope and light of Jesus' coming and Jesus' promise to come again - to bring justice and shalom to the earth. How do we acknowledge the darkness of our world without dwelling on it?

**Advent 1 - Sunday, December 3rd:** Isaiah 64:1-9; Psalm 80:1-7, 17-19; 1 Corinthians 1:3-9; Mark 13:24-37 (Katie Graber, a member of the Voices Together hymnal committee, will be with us in worship and will also speak during the Sunday School hour.)

**Advent 2 - Sunday, December 10th:** Isaiah 40:1-11; Psalm 85:1-2, 8-13; II Peter 3:8-15a; Mark 1:1-8. (Noteworthy, from Pettisville High School, and the Zion Choir will be singing. We will also celebrate communion together.)

**Advent 3 - Sunday, December 17th:** Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11; Psalm 126 or Luke 1:46b-55; I Thessalonians 5:16-24; John 1:6-8, 19-28.

## Spiritual Leadership Team Minutes

November 13, 2023

**Devotional:** Mike led us in a discussion of chapter 10 of *Pursuing God's Will Together*. The focus was a revisiting of the idea of holy indifference. Some concepts that can help lead us towards this indifference would be realizing that we can't see the future, developing a quiet trust which is difficult in the complicated world, and opening ourselves to new ideas. An indifferent state can bring us increased wisdom. The devotional time ended with prayer.

Hymnal proposal: We invited Karen Ruth, co-chair of the worship team, to attend the first part of the meeting to talk about the worship team presenting the *Voices Together* hymnal to the congregation. The worship team used the Communication Checklist developed during the Lombard Process as they thought through how to introduce a proposal for the new hymnals to the congregation. They plan to have a table set up on several Sundays so people can look at hymn books and worship resources, and ask questions of worship team members. It will also be an opportunity for the worship team to listen to feedback. A spreadsheet will be used to record feedback and it can be summarized and shared with the congregation at some point. She explained that Katie Graber will be here December 3 to introduce the hymnal, giving an opportunity for the congregation to sing songs from it. During Sunday School she will talk more about how the hymnal was developed and answer questions.

**Pastoral retreat:** Sue gave a report about the weekend pastor and spouse retreat and thanked everyone for the opportunity to go. The retreat was at a beautiful location, and a big highlight for her was the notes of encouragement that the retreat organizers had arranged for pastors and spouses to get from members of their congregations.

**SLT Retreat planning:** Cal and Cheryl Britsch have offered their cabin in Coldwater, Marble Lake as a place for us to meet. Available dates for the retreat are Friday/Saturday of the weekend of January 13th or 20th. Two possible topics for the weekend were discussed:

- 1) Ways to encourage spiritual practices in the congregation
- 2) The Colossian forum as a possible resource for discussing issues. Each of us could look at the Colossian Forum website before our next meeting and see what we might want to consider.

**SLT Covenant:** We read the covenant aloud to refresh our memory, discussed a few possible tweeks, and signed the covenant. We also discussed where and how we are storing SLT meeting minutes.

Facilitating new visions – Mike had compiled the comments from the congregation made in response to the presentation about facilitating new visions and shared them at the SLT meeting. (These were comments collected during the Sunday worship service in the fellowship hall on Dan's last Sunday.) We read through the comments and determined that the congregation seems affirming of the plan. Mike will work on getting these comments into a format that can easily be shared with the congregation, and then we will make available the checklist that helps people think through implementing an idea.

**Ohio Conference** – January 9 is our regional winter delegate meeting date, which will be held at Tedrow Mennonite this time. Attending from Zion will be Greg, Barb, Sue and John David.
