Ongoing Classes

<u>Elective Sunday School class</u>: Zion will be continuing the adult Sunday School series exploring issues relating to the end of life. What do we believe about death and dying? How do we live the end of our lives faithfully and lovingly? What is most important to us in those moments? The class will also look at topics like planning for funerals, medical ethics, and communicating our wishes and values with family members. The sessions will be held Jan. 7, 14, 28, and Feb. 4 in the Fellowship Hall. They are intended for adults of all ages.

From January through May, John David will be offering two evening classes a week. Tuesday nights will focus on exploring and practicing spiritual disciplines together. This contemplative time of seeking God begins Jan. 23 with *Creating a Rule of Life*.

Thursday evenings will be a teaching time on topics such as Scripture and theology. We will begin on Jan. 11 by participating in Ohio Mennonite Conference's Winter Read, discussing the book *Not Quite Fine: Mental Health, Faith and Showing Up for One Another* by Carlene Hill Byron. These conversations will be held online by Zoom, so you can participate from home or come to the church to join Zoom with others from Zion.

Voices Together

Proposal: Worship Team recommends purchasing copies of **Voices Together** for the pews, several large-print editions, several copies of the Worship Leader resource book, an accompaniment book, and the projection software. We plan to keep the blue Hymnal Worship book also, but will remove the red hymnal, **Sing a New Creation** and **Sing the Journey**. We will offer some of those copies to the congregation and will also store some in the music room. Between money that has been donated and unspecified donated memorial money, we will be able to pay for the whole project.

Feedback: Most of the feedback from the congregation has been positive and favorable toward purchasing the hymnal. Some people were happy to see the confusion of hymnals in the pews change, and suggested keeping the blue hymnals. A number of people expressed appreciation for the theology in many of the new hymns. Some accompanists and musicians like having the chords on many of the songs. Some like the international songs that connect us to the wider church.

Some people expressed concern with changes in language in the texts of some hymns, which were addressed by Katie Graber and the **Voices Together** website. Some also commented on the thinness of the pages in the new book. Katie Graber explained that the publisher has changed printers, and the copies we would purchase have a little thicker paper.

Seminary Update from Sue

Many of you have been asking what classes I have this semester, and how much longer I have yet to go. Since I am in the home stretch, it felt like a good time for an extended update.

First of all, I want to say how much I appreciate all of your support for me in my studies at AMBS. You have encouraged me, prayed for me, and been extremely understanding and flexible with my schedule and availability. Please know how deep-ly grateful I am, and that I do not take any of this lightly. I am also thankful for the support of the College Student Financial Aid Committee, whose financial assistance has made seminary a possibility for me.

Spring semester began this past week, and I am taking two courses. One is called "Ministry in Church and World," which is a two semester course that I began last fall. This course has a weekly class time on Zoom, and also an internship-type of placement. For this placement, I have chosen to serve as a volunteer at CHP Home Care and Hospice, in order to learn more about the services they offer. While I am primarily based at the Hospice In-Patient Center in Defiance, I have also volunteered at the Adult Day Care at the Archbold CHP location, and ridden along with the hospice nurses as they see patients in their homes or in nursing care facilities.

The second course I have is called "Senior Capstone." It's typically one of the last courses AMBS students take before graduation. I'll have several final papers to write for this course, and will work on preparing for my senior exit interview defense. This course also has a weekly class session on Zoom.

My schedule for the semester looks like this: Senior Capstone class on Zoom on Tuesday evenings. Ministry in Church and World class on Zoom on Wednesday afternoons, and my volunteer internship with CHP all day on Thursdays.

In mid-March, I'll go to campus for my Senior Interview. The interview is with a panel of professors who have reviewed my written work, transcripts, and portfolio. I will give an oral presentation on my work, and be prepared to respond to their questions. The exact date for the interview has not yet been finalized. When it is, I'll let you know. I would appreciate prayer!

Assuming I pass this interview, and assuming I complete all my assignments this semester, I'll participate in graduation on Saturday, April 27th! As is common for many students, there is one course I'll still need to complete this summer. So, in mid -July, I'll be totally finished with my Master of Divinity degree, Pastoral Ministry concentration. (SO excited about this!! It's been 6.5 years of taking 1-2 courses every fall, spring, and summer semester.)
