New Announcements

Note about Dan Miller's attendance at Orville Doehrmann's memorial service: Dan contacted the Spiritual Leadership Team, PCRC chair, and Council chair this week to ask for our discernment about attending the memorial service. Zion has an exit agreement with former pastors which requests a one year period of separation. This period of time allows both the pastor and the congregation to observe healthy boundaries and move forward. Dan's situation is unique in that he moved into the role of interim Conference Minister for Ohio Conference after leaving Zion. This means that Dan's obligations as our Conference Minister may bring him back to Zion, or into contact with congregants, during this one year period. Dan acknowledged these obligations with us as he prepared to leave Zion. The SLT was in agreement that Dan's presence at this memorial service would be appropriate as a representative of Ohio Conference, supporting Tony (our Conference Regional Pastor) during his time of significant loss. The pastors and elders welcome you to talk with them if you have questions or concerns.

<u>Elective Sunday School class:</u> Beginning this Sunday, Zion will be offering an adult Sunday School series exploring issues relating to the end of life. What do we believe about death and dying? How do we live the end of our lives faithfully and lovingly? What is most important to us in those moments? The class will also look at topics like planning for funerals, medical ethics, and communicating our wishes and values with family members. The sessions will be held Jan. 7, 14, 28, and Feb. 4 in the Fellowship Hall. They are intended for adults of all ages.

From January through May, John David will be offering two evening classes a week. Tuesday nights will focus on exploring and practicing spiritual disciplines together. This contemplative time of seeking God begins Jan. 23 with *Creating a Rule of Life*.

Spiritual Leadership Team minutes

December 15, 2023

Devotions: John David led devotions focusing on chapter 11 of *Pursuing God's Will Together*. This chapter talks about the ways in which leaders can hold effective meetings. An important part of the process is clarifying the purpose of any given meeting. If some people come to a meeting expecting a decision to be made, while others come thinking the plan is to just discuss or brainstorm, there are bound to be disappointments. Another consideration is the value of coming to a meeting with as much information beforehand as possible. Leaders can think about what the people at the meeting will want to know and be prepared for questions and concerns. It is also helpful to create times of silence within a meeting for people to process information. Devotion time was closed with prayer by John David.

Follow-up from last meeting:

- Sue will make sure that everyone has signed the elder covenant for this year, and will distribute copies for our files.
- We need to finalize plans for making available the materials for facilitating new visions. Mike asked everyone to look over the document he put together with responses from the congregation. The planning document for those who would like to implement an idea will be touched up by Barb. When both the responses and the planning document are ready, they will be shared in the newsletter and paper copies will be made available also. Eventually, the planning document will be made available on the Zion website.
- The worship team's work to present the idea of purchasing the *Voices Together* hymnal has progressed well. The worship team will be meeting soon to discuss the information they have collected and consider next steps.
- We reviewed the date and time for the Ohio Conference delegate cluster meeting. Delegates and pastors need to register so the organizers have a head count.

Spiritual input opportunities:

- John David would like to provide opportunities for spiritual formation. His thoughts are to offer a time on Tuesdays that would focus on different types of spiritual practices, and one on Thursday that might focus more on specific topics.
- People in the congregation might want to consider taking part in the Ohio Conference Winter Read with the book *Not Quite Fine: Mental Health, Faith, and Showing Up for One Another* by Carlene Hill Byron. Discussions about the book will take place on January 11 and 18, and February 1, 8, and 15.

SLT Retreat: We will hold our annual retreat Friday evening, January 19 and Saturday January 20. Friday evening will be set aside for fellowship together. On Saturday, our focus will be practicing several spiritual disciplines, as we consider how to provide opportunities for spiritual formation at Zion. We will also plan to hold our regular January SLT meeting on Saturday.

Pastoral concerns were discussed.
