# Spiritual Leadership Team minutes

January 20, 2024 (during the SLT retreat)

<u>Review</u>: We began with a review of what had been discussed at the last meeting and where those things stood now. Action items included:

- Sue will finalize the signing of the SLT covenant
- Mike will get the reactions to the proposal for facilitating new visions out in the newsletter by the end of February.
- Barb will send a final draft of the document containing the steps for planning new visions out for the SLT to look over before publishing.
- John David's weekly opportunities for spiritual formation have been announced, and will begin this week. There seems to be interest.

Ohio Conference Delegate Cluster meeting: Those who were at the Ohio Conference Cluster meeting at Tedrow on January 9 reviewed what had been discussed. After all of the regional delegate cluster meetings have been held, the compiled information and feedback about the new Conference structure will be sent to pastors and delegates to share with congregations. Annual Conference Assembly is the first weekend of March.

<u>End-of-Life Sunday School Hour Discussions:</u> There have been positive reactions to the Sunday School sessions about end-of-life topics. John David felt it had worked out well that the Congregational Caregivers had raised the idea of discussing these topics with the congregation at a time when he was also feeling the importance of sharing about this based on his experiences working as a chaplain. Questions raised during these discussions may offer ideas for future classes.

<u>SLT Retreat</u>: Mike will share a statement with highlights about our retreat with the congregation. Sue will type up the ideas from our retreat brainstorming session. For now, we will rest with the ideas and contemplate them. The next step will be to begin to process and discern what the next steps should be with what was discussed.
