Sue's seminary update

Thank you so much for your prayers and words of encouragement for my senior interview last Monday! During the interview process, I was first required to offer a 20 minute presentation. Afterward, the panel questioned me about what I presented, as well as questioned me about the papers that I had submitted, and my journey through seminary. I was quite nervous ahead of the interview because I knew they could literally ask me anything from the past 6 years of work! I am happy to report that the process all went very well, and I am approved for graduation at the end of April!

For the rest of this semester, I have one final paper left to complete, several more weeks of class, and several more weeks of my internship placement at the hospice in-patient center in Defiance. Graduation weekend is Friday, April 26th - Saturday, April 27th. The weekend includes the Dean's Luncheon, official photos, and the Commissioning Service on Friday, as well as graduation rehearsal, more photos, and the Commencement Ceremony on Saturday. The Friday Commissioning Service and the Saturday Commencement Ceremony will also be available to watch live online. If you are interested in watching either of these, I can provide the links when they are available.

During the months of May, June, and July, I'll be finishing up a course that I began last summer. At the end of July, then, I'll be totally and completely done with my Master of Divinity degree program. It's challenging to get all of the course requirements completed by graduation, especially since some of them are not offered each year. Many students end up "graduating," and then finishing up a summer class, or even a summer class and a fall class, in good faith. I know some of my fellow graduates will also be continuing their work for a time beyond graduation weekend.

I am so deeply grateful for all of your support. I brag about all of you often, telling my professors and classmates what a wonderful congregation I serve. Thank you for accompanying me on this journey!
