### Zion Budget Update

Thank you for your generous budget support! Zion's 2023-24 budget is \$416,400. Divided by 12 months, the offerings needed average \$34,700 per month. Zion ended 2023 on a strong note. Our offerings showed a \$64,000 surplus balance. However, since January of 2024, the monthly totals have decreased by \$11,000 on average. With 5 months remaining in the budget year, Zion needs to average \$29,000 per month to meet the budget. Please check in with stewardship members if you have questions or concerns.

### Spiritual Leadership Team minutes March 19, 2024

**Opening** – Greg led the opening by challenging us to think about the tension between taking care of those close to us and reaching out to the outside world. The world uses terms like "deglobalization" to promote the idea of looking after your own interests and not getting involved with problems of other countries. As Christians, how do we respond by helping others while also protecting ourselves? How do we know the best way to help others locally or globally?

**Elder search** - We looked at the current elder ministry description. The plan is for everyone to read it over and suggest edits that might be needed before our next meeting. We discussed the value of starting conversations with people we felt might be a good fit for the position. The conversation wouldn't have to be a direct request for them to consider the role, but more of a way to help them start thinking of the possibility.

**Addition to prayer list** - As we discussed some of the work various ministry teams do at church, it was suggested that it might be encouraging to add the teams to the prayer list for the Church and World periodically.

**Membership transfer** - The church office received an email requesting LaVon and Linda Short's transfer of membership from Zion to Waterford Mennonite in Goshen, where they have been attending. Sue has completed the necessary paperwork for this.

**ACA further reporting** - Mike asked if there were any other topics from the Annual Conference Assembly of Ohio Conference that we should talk about. Those who attended felt that all topics had been covered at the last meeting. John David brought up a topic from the last Pastor Peer meeting that related to the theme at ACA. The Pastor Peer group discussed the idea of congregations interacting more with each other. Some suggestions were pulpit exchanges and helping each other to support special events. An example would be the Disarming Violence event that was held at Central last fall, which was planned by persons from several area Mennonite churches.

The next meeting will be on Monday, April 8 at 5:00. Sue will have the opening.
