# **Pastoral Review**

The Pastor Congregation Relations Committee (PCRC) is patterning the upcoming pastoral review after the review document that was used in 2020, along with some updates. The PCRC has conferred with the Interim Conference Minister, Dan Miller, to look over the survey before releasing it to the congregation to be completed. The PCRC also asked the pastors to fill out a form about themselves, which will be compared to the congregation's feedback.

The review process timeline will be as follows:

- · November 10th: Surveys are available for completion and will close on December 10th.
- **December/ January:** PCRC will compile and evaluate the responses to the survey.
- · January/ February: PCRC will review a summary of the evaluation and responses with Pastors and Elders
- · February/March: PCRC will provide the Congregation with a summary of results.

Electronic survey responses are encouraged via Google Docs and a link will be provided. Paper surveys are available on the table across the mailboxes, and PCRC members would also be willing to have face-to-face sit-downs to receive direct input from congregants and a sign-up sheet is available for those on the table.

# Mark Nafziger's Nepal Trip

The Museum of Modern Art first envisioned this global visual arts program in 1953, and President John F. Kennedy formalized it at the U.S. Department of State in 1963. Today, Art in Embassies is an official visual arts office within the U.S. Department of State, engaging over 20,000 participants globally, including artists, museums, galleries, universities, and private collectors. Growing out of this exhibit has arisen an invitation to be an Arts Envoy.

The Arts Envoy Program engages American artists and arts professionals in cultural exchange programs and shares the best of the U.S. arts community with the world to foster cross-cultural understanding and collaboration, to demonstrate shared values and aspirations. American arts professionals -- including performing artists, visual artists, poets, playwrights, chefs, dancers, theatrical and film directors, curators, and others -- travel overseas to conduct workshops, give performances, and mentor young people. U.S. artists also engage online through virtual programs that often allow for greater reach and longer-term connections. # Spiritual Leadership Team

October 14, 2024

**Pastor Evaluations:** Greg opened the meeting by inviting Micah Frankenfield to update us on the progress Pastor Congregation Relations Committee (PCRC) is making on the plans to begin pastor evaluations. Micah had shared the current evaluation plans with interim Conference Minister, Dan Miller, and relayed to the SLT information from his response. Another item of discussion in relation to the pastor evaluations had to do with ways to inform the congregation of the process for completing the evaluation.

The PCRC will meet within the next 10 days and get specific dates on the process, and will make a verbal announcement this coming Sunday. (which was October 20)

**Devotion:** Our devotion was led by Sue, and centered on chapter four of the book *Divine Gravity* by Meghan Good. This chapter addresses the question of why people don't go to church. The author asks us to consider how we could continue to evolve how we worship together to fit the needs of this time and place, but emphasizes that the church cannot continue to carry out God's purpose if the followers of Jesus each go their own way and abandon the idea of a community working together with one purpose.

**Sue's Sabbatical:** The topic from *Divine Gravity* was a good lead into Sue sharing about her sabbatical. She detailed for us the things she appreciated having the chance to do, and what she also learned about boundaries through this experience. The final element of her sabbatical discussed was her time visiting other churches.

Congregational Annual Meeting: It was decided that Greg would read the SLT report at the Congregational Annual Meeting on October 20, 2024. He will make sure to acknowledge Mike's time on SLT. Reviewing previous discussions, we learned that there are still some funds left from memorial donations. There is also money available for use in the aid fund and the compassion fund.

### Pastoral Concerns were discussed.

**Next meeting:** The next SLT meeting will be on November 11, at 5:30. Suz will lead the opening using chapter 5 of *Divine Gravity* as the center of the conversation.
