November 24: Read Philippians chapter 4. (focus will be on verses 4-13)

Advent 2024 - "Together on the Journey" - This year's theme focuses on the image of a hike along the way in community with one another. Where can we see God's guiding hand directing our steps as we anticipate encountering Jesus - God With Us - afresh this season?

Longest Night Service - Wednesday, December 18th @ 7:00pm: The winter solstice (Dec 21st) marks the day of the longest hours of darkness and shortest hours of daylight of the year. Some churches use this occasion to acknowledge grief. This observance is a short and quiet service of readings, prayer, and candle lighting. Grief can take many forms, from the death of a loved one to the loss that comes from a change in life situation. All are welcome to this space to receive comfort.

Christmas Eve Service - Tuesday, December 24th @ 7:00pm: Come celebrate at this short service of joy for all ages! We'll conclude with our traditional candle light singing of "Silent Night."

# **Pastoral Review**

The Pastor Congregation Relations Committee (PCRC) is patterning the upcoming pastoral review after the review document that was used in 2020, along with some updates. The PCRC has conferred with the Interim Conference Minister, Dan Miller, to look over the survey before releasing it to the congregation to be completed. The PCRC also asked the pastors to fill out a form about themselves, which will be compared to the congregation's feedback.

The review process timeline will be as follows:

- · November 10th: Surveys are available for completion and will close on December 10th.
- · **December/ January:** PCRC will compile and evaluate the responses to the survey.
- · January/ February: PCRC will review a summary of the evaluation and responses with Pastors and Elders
- · February/March: PCRC will provide the Congregation with a summary of results.

Electronic survey responses are encouraged via Google Docs and a link will be provided. Paper surveys are available on the table across the mailboxes, and PCRC members would also be willing to have face-to-face sit-downs to receive direct input from congregants and a sign-up sheet is available for those on the table.
