Lent 2025 - "Bread of Life: Gather. Savor. Share" The world feels heavy—divided and uncertain. Hearts ache, minds seek peace, and souls hunger for hope. Amid injustice and tragedies, we remember we must first gather around the table for strength so we can respond with love and grace. This Lent, let us gather together to break bread, savor the divine generosity of God, and rise to share with the world out of the abundance we have received from the Bread of Life. The table is open. Come, be renewed.

Lent 6 - Palm Sunday, April 13th: "Bread for the Road" - John 12:12-16; Luke 19:28-40 (Triumphal Entry)

Holy Week Drop-In Prayer and Spiritual Practices: The sanctuary will be open from 8:00am-12:00pm, Monday, April 14 - Friday, April 18 for anyone to come to sit in God's presence, pray, read scripture, draw, write, etc...This will be unstructured time to come and go as you wish.

<u>Thursday, April 17th - Maundy Thursday Soup Supper, 6:00pm</u>. Come remember Jesus' final Passover meal with his disciples, in which Jesus washed their feet, and instituted the bread and cup as symbols of his body and blood given for each of us. We'll gather together around the fellowship hall tables to eat a light soup supper, study scripture, wash one another's feet or hands, and serve one another communion. We will also collect our annual offering for the Aid Fund, which helps with financial needs within the congregation.

<u>Friday, April 18th - Good Friday Service, 7:00pm</u>. Join us in the sanctuary for a short observance of scripture readings and the extinguishing of candles. We'll depart this service in silence to remember the sense of heaviness and hopelessness that descended upon the disciples on the day of Jesus' arrest, trial, and crucifixion.

<u>Sunday, April 20th - Easter Sunday Celebration:</u> Come early for a breakfast potluck beginning at 8:30am, and hymn sing beginning at 9:00am. Worship at 9:30am.

Monday, April 21st - Church office closed.

<u>Sunday, April 27th - CHAOS Sunday and the MYF taco bar fundraising lunch:</u> Save the date and invite your family and friends! Our CHAOS (6th-8th grade youth) are planning the service and will be leading us in worship. Stay for lunch - prepared and served by our MYF (high school youth) to fund their summer trip to Convention and other future service projects.

Sunday, May 4 - Church School Day: Dr. Rebecca Stoltzfus, President of Goshen College, will visit and share the morning message. After worship we'll have a session in the fellowship hall for all interested to explain Zion's student aid program, hear additional input from President Stoltzfus, & give opportunity to pledge financial support toward the program. Next school year Zion will have five students at the Mennonite schools. We have a fundraising goal of \$94,000 for the year.
