This can spark discussions about gun violence and peacemaking. Refugee Update and Request

The Resettlement Support Team (RST) would like to share a few updates. The RST was formed in 2022 as a partnership between Central and Zion with the purpose of helping immigrant families as they settle in our area. In 2023, we sponsored two Ukrainian families for a 2 year period. Although a number of immigration programs have been terminated or scaled back in recent months, thankfully the Uniting for Ukraine program is ongoing and our families were able to renew their stay for another two years.

Currently, our team could use some help with transportation. Both families have had car trouble in recent months. We are looking for leads on affordable used cars in good condition or volunteers with mechanical ability that might be willing to help with repairs, etc. We are also looking for some more volunteers to join our transportation team. This team receives an email when our families need a lift and can't get there themselves. With enough people on the list, we can increase our odds that at least one person might be available to help.
