Join MCC Great Lakes for the Dismukes Gala on August 16: The third annual Dismukes Gala Fundraiser will spotlight the amazing story of Dr. Henry Dodford Dismukes, an African American physician in Kimball, West Virginia, in the early 1900s. Join us on Saturday, August 16, at 6 p.m. at the Jack Caffery Arts & Cultural Center in Welch, West Virginia, for dinner and live music from The Company Band. Funds raised at the gala will go towards rehabilitating the building that previously was the Henrietta Dismukes Nurses Home and has fallen into disrepair after decades of vacancy. As proposed by our community steering committee, the Nurses Home will be repurposed as a community learning center with classes on technology and literacy education, canning, gardening, knitting and cooking, along with tutoring opportunities for students in the area. With the recent flooding that occurred in McDowell County, we are also dedicating a portion of funds raised towards flood clean-up through MCC's Appalachia Build program. MCUSA Convention 2025 Reflection

Last Sunday, July 13th, the MYF and their sponsors did an amazing job sharing stories, photos, and highlights from their week at Convention in Greensboro, North Carolina. If you missed it, I'd encourage you to watch the recording and hear what they had to say. Seeing the energy last week of youth from across the country at Convention was definitely one of my highlights! There's nothing quite like watching youth groups hurrying into the worship space each evening to get a front row seat, or singing with gusto at the two morning Hymn Sings, to encourage your heart. Personally, I always love the opportunities that Convention offers to reconnect with seminary friends and pastor friends from across the church, as well as make new connections.

As you heard the youth and sponsors mention, it was wonderful to worship, attend seminars, enjoy delicious food, and have fun together! It was also exciting to see Rachel Ringenberg Miller kick off our opening worship service on Tuesday night. (Rachel grew up at Zion, served as youth pastor here, pastored in several other churches, and now serves as the Denominational Minister for Ministerial Leadership.)

During the delegate session, which was all day on Friday, delegates sang together, and listened to several texts preached from Mark's gospel. There were four pieces of business for our consideration, with time for table discussion and comments from the floor. The items were: (1) Denominational bylaw changes related to the integration of Mennonite Education Agency (MEA) into the Executive Board's structure; (2) Denominational bylaw changes for consistency/clarity to the Executive Board's authority/oversight of executive directors of churchwide agencies; (3) Denominational bylaw changes related to the Prevention and Accountability Resolution (abuse and misconduct); and (4) Revisions to the 2013 Churchwide Statement on Immigration. Each of these passed overwhelmingly, with the "no" votes and abstentions recorded. You are welcome to talk with the pastors if you'd like to learn more.

We greatly appreciated your prayers for each of us last week. The next Convention is July 6-10, 2027 in Cincinnati, so consider joining us for a day or two, or for the week!
