Ohio Conference Safety Liaison: Do you have a passion for keeping our churches safe?

Ohio Mennonite Conference, along with other area conferences of Mennonite Church USA, will soon be implementing a new Abuse Prevention and Accountability Policy. The policy stresses preventing abuse and will provide consistency in how conferences handle cases of pastoral misconduct.

As part of implementation, each conference will have a "Conference Safety Liaison", who will serve as a point person within the conference for education on preventing abuse and will also work with conference staff to respond to reported misconduct.

We are looking for a volunteer to serve in the role (stipend and travel costs covered), who is part of an OMC congregation and brings interest and skills in this area.
