Advent 2025 Worship: The Mystery of the Incarnation: As we look forward to the Second Coming of Christ, we remember the first coming of Jesus. This year during Advent, we want to focus on the mystery and gift of the Incarnation, a time when heaven and earth intersected. We look forward to a second Incarnation when Christ will bring shalom to all people. We will follow the lectionary texts with John 1 as an underlying text.

Sunday, Dec 14th - Advent 3: "He Came Down That We Might Have JOY" (Psalm 146:5-10; Luke 1:39-56)

Wednesday, Dec 17th - Longest Night Service @ 7:00pm: The winter solstice (Dec 21st) marks the point in the year when there are the longest number of hours of darkness, and the shortest hours of daylight. Some churches use this occasion to hold a special service, on or near this date, to acknowledge grief and loss. This observance is a very short, simple, and quiet service of readings, prayers, and candle lighting. Grief can take many forms - from the death of a loved one, to a sense of loss that accompanies a change in life situation. All are welcome to this space.

Sunday, Dec 21st - Advent 4: "He Came Down That We Might Have LOVE." (Matthew 1:18-25)

Wednesday, Dec 24th - Christmas Eve Service @ 7:00pm: Our theme this year is "The Promise." Come celebrate Emmanuel (God with us) at this service of beautiful music, scripture, favorite Christmas carols, and candlelight "Silent Night." We will also collect our annual offering for the aid fund.

Sunday, Dec 28th - Christmas Sunday (Matthew 2:13-23)
